Dear B.O.N.E.S. Family,

As the end of 2007 approaches, we would like to take a moment to be thankful for all that we have accomplished together over the past year.

This year, as in years past, we have been successful in our mission to rescue, rehome, spay/neuter and provide necessary medical care to beagles in need in the New England Area. Certainly, the biggest story in 2007 for B.O.N.E.S. was the "Limington Beagles" situation, in which we took in, vetted, and subsequently re-homed fourteen beagles from one home. However, it certainly was not the only success of the past year. Other special beagles to find their home through B.O.N.E.S. this year include Miss Ethel, who spent the first few years of her life in a puppy mill; Snoopy, who was abandoned by his previous owners; and Sheila (now Shelley) who has been transformed from a confused, insecure stray little girl into a wonderful family pet. B.O.N.E.S. also suffered a tremendous loss this year, when dedicated volunteer - and adopter of B.O.N.E.S. beagle Keifer - Jeanne Faircloth passed away in June. She is missed greatly by all those that had the opportunity to know and work with her.

Picture This!

BONES volunteers come in many different ‘colors’: foster care givers, adoption counselors, transporters, fundraisers, administrators, event planners, gift-wrappers...you might say we could fill an artist’s palette. Add to that volunteer prism – one through which we rescue, foster and place beagles into permanent and loving homes – local artist Carol Chretien of Westport, MA. Carol is inspired as a lifelong animal lover and artist (in equal parts) to donate her works to various animal rescue organizations through a ‘virtual’ non-profit, called Artists Helping Animals (AHA). I had an opportunity to speak with Carol recently at her studio (see photo), by phone.

Carol’s involvement with Artists Helping Animals officially began in March 2006 at AHA’s inception, but she has been painting animals, mostly dogs and primarily Dalmatians (her favorite breed), for about four years. A fellow artist named Stella Violano, founder and current leader of AHA, had the idea of coalescing other talented artists, through the Internet, to help charities by donating their works and Carol enthusiastically joined the fledgling group as a founding member. From Carol’s perspective AHA is successful because the artists self-manage all their own clients, operations and donations; percentages of proceeds are completely discretionary and she also contributes individual financial and in-kind donations. Through Artists Helping Animals, Carol enjoys not only fellowship and collaboration with her artistic peers but finds a fulfilling outlet for her tremendous creative talents and her philanthropic endeavors.

How Carol discovered BONES is a (brush?) stroke of luck. She happened upon a stack of BONES business cards in a health food store in New Bedford, MA several years ago. Until then most of her donated works went to recipients in California and as a New England native, she was glad to find a local dog rescue. She was and is the only East Coast member of AHA at present. Her experiences with BONES have been “wonderful” and she loves painting beagles, with their “expressive faces and eyes”; however any animal is portrait-worthy in her estimate and she welcomes consultations for private commissions. The Internet has been a gateway to Carol’s becoming involved with other animal rescue organizations in addition to BONES. Recently at the 2007 BONES Bash online auction, for example, she thought that the highest bidder for one of her donated prizes of a complimentary animal portrait was a BONES member until the lucky winner identified herself from Washington state AND a member of a Seattle beagle rescue. Carol thought that the winner was someone who was actually *at* the BASH, but it was a woman who saw her beautiful paintings online and “Maggie” (see photo) is a fine example of the culmination of Artists Helping Animals plus BONES helping beagles.

Rescue activities seem to be part of Carol’s destiny. After being on a ten-year hiatus from painting due to personal reasons, she re-entered the art world in 2003 when she offered to re-paint a ‘botched’ mural job, for free, for acquaintances of her parents. “It was a rescue mission – I guess it’s rescue with me”, she declares excitedly. Post-mural, her first painting was of Lizzie, her beloved Dalmatian; until then she had mostly dabbled in landscapes, seascapes and still life. Painting Lizzie was a catalyst and from there, and with the aid of her new computer, she built momentum towards integrating her artist’s soul with her philanthropic efforts. Carol considers the opportunity to combine her two great passions, animals and oil painting, a blessing. In helping homeless animals by painting for them, she brings to light their needs and has found true passion and purpose. In the wake of Thanksgiving and as the holidays loom, BONES is especially grateful to share in the generosity of such a gifted and generous artist as Carol Chretien.


