

Hudson is a beagle rescued by B.O.N.E.S. from a bad situation in Limington, ME.







I Love You, But You're Not My Dog

I sit writing this with tears streaming down my face. If this were ten years ago, I would have to stop as the script on the page would be all blurry. My foster of over six months went to his forever home this morning.

My mission is to save as many as I can. I love him, but he's not my dog.

He came a broken spirit—scared, depressed, and fearful. He had no boundaries, no training.

"No," you can't jump at me when I'm preparing food. "No," you can't jump into the bowl as I am putting it on the floor. "No," you can't jump at the door when you want to come in.

"No," you can't have all the treats now."

I did not want him to learn only "No". He was a very sweet, sensitive dog under all that beagle craziness.

Goal #1: training. Luckily, beagles are so food driven and he was so smart and eager to please that it became a joy.

"No," you may not jump on me when I'm preparing food, but "Yes," you may do the beagle dance in the middle of the kitchen.

"No," You may not jump into the bowl, but sit and stay works even when your little front feet wiggle as if they want to take off any minute.

"No," you may not jump on the back door to get in, but that same "sit and stay" will get you a treat when you walk in nicely.

Relieving him of fear was a bit harder, took a bit longer, but the same consistent commands finally relieved him of all that internal pain.

I knew I had a happy dog the day he started using the agility equipment right alongside my dog with the biggest smile on his face. I knew I had a happy dog when he socialized with the other dogs.

And I knew I had a happy dog when a stranger's pat made him relax and no long tense.

He left today confident, joyful and trusting, ready to live the life any beagle (or any dog) should live. That is why I foster. If I adopted another, I would have no room to foster. If I adopt one more, I would only save one more.

That is why a few minutes of loss, a few minutes of tears are worth it. He was the ninth dog that I prepared to live with a forever family.

Baking for Beagles

Making safe and natural treats for your favorite chow hounds. $\ensuremath{\mathsf{S}}\xspace$ M Bridges

As we all know, treats are a huge part of a beagle's life. Any training is done with a tidbit of something tasty because they respond so well to food rewards. And who doesn't give a treat just because they're looking so very adorable? But with all of the recent recalls of treats and foods, what are owners supposed to do to keep our fur babies happy and healthy?

It is not a pretty cake (it kind of looks like a giant brown biscuit) but I took a bite... and it wasn't bad... for a dog treat.

Celebration Cake

- 2 cups organic grated carrot (do not dry)
- 1 egg
- 1/2 cup natural peanut butter
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1 tsp pure vanilla extract
- 1/3 cup light agave syrup or a "less sweet" honey such as lavender (do not use the "bear" honey, it's too sugary)
- 1 1/2 cup whole wheat flour
- 1 tsp baking soda

1. Heat oven to 350 degrees and spray a light olive oil based cooking spray on your pan of choice. This is a small cake so I used one round 9-inch cake pan.

2. Combine egg, peanut butter, oil, vanilla, carrots and agave syrup/honey in a large bowl and mix well.

3. Sift together the whole wheat flour and baking soda so they incorporate evenly and then add to the wet mixture.

4. Spoon into the cake pan (this is a thick, lumpy batter, more like bread dough than traditional cake batter) and bake in oven for 20-25 minutes or until a cake tester or knife comes out clean.

5. Let cool completely.


You can use Greek yogurt mixed with cream cheese to make a frosting if you like (mix various amounts of each until you get a frosting consistency); do NOT use traditional frosting as it is too sugary. Human grade food coloring is completely safe, however it CAN change the color of your dog's urine or feces. Do not be alarmed if you see colored nuggets in the yard.

Also don't use powdered sugar or jimmies or any other "traditional" cake decorating items.



When its time to say good-bye ...




There are no words to soothe or comfort a grieving heart. For as long as we rescue, adopt, foster and love these little ones, we will know the pain of their passing.

The spotlight of the booth however, was on two lovable B.O.N.E.S. representatives foster beagle Missy and recently adopted Henry.


